

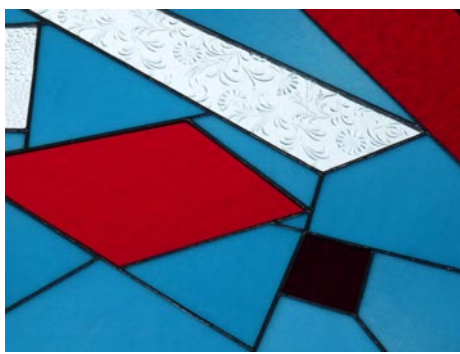

ENO Gallery in Hillsborough, NC, Offers Works by Vicki Grant

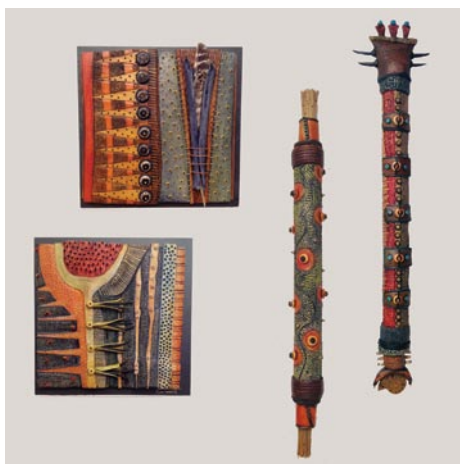
ENO Gallery in Hillsborough, NC, is presenting *Carolina Spirits*, featuring works by Vicki Grant, on view in the Lower Gallery, through Nov. 23, 2014.

Grant's solo exhibition includes evocative new spiritual and totemic sculptural wall pieces and vessels in clay and mixed media.

Grant's forms begin with high fired porcelain and utilize clay, glass, metal, fossils, and numerous exotic natural objects. Utilizing her unusual and complex process, she manipulates form, texture, and color to create her intricate and mystical sculptures.

Each sculptural piece is unique in form, detail and color. The compositional design and intricate fastening of objects to the pieces imbue her work with intricate details that draw the viewer closer.

Grant says, "I explore the complex process of manipulating form, texture, materials, and color to create an emotional response from those interacting with the piece. Connecting to the viewer is the ultimate goal of my work."

FRANK Gallery in Chapel Hill, NC, Offers Exhibition of NC Glass

In a show that will enrich the holiday season with color and light, FRANK Gallery, in Chapel Hill, NC, is pleased to present the work of nationally and internationally known glass artists from the mountains of North Carolina and from the Triangle, beginning Nov. 11, 2014, and continuing through Jan. 4, 2015. FRANK will host an opening reception for the show on Friday Nov. 14, from 6-9pm.

This unique show brings together Penland, NC, glass artists Valerie and Rick Beck, William and Katherine Bernstein, Greg Fidler, Rob Levin and Kenny Pieper as well as FRANK glass artists Lucartha Kohler and Madonna Phillips.

Working both in blown and cast glass, Valerie and Rick Beck have created pieces in their Spruce Pine, NC, studio since 1991 and show their work throughout the country. In 1991, the Becks were among only 100 glass artists selected among thousands by the Corning Museum of Glass to be published in the prestigious *New Glass Review 12*. Since 1992, the Becks' work has been featured six times in *American Craft Magazine*, as well as *Glass Magazine*.

William and Katherine Bernstein still live in the Celso, NC, log cabin they moved into in 1970 and have been at the forefront of the modern glass movement for more than 30 years. They collaborate on a highly sought-after line of goblets and tableware, while each artist also works independently – Katherine on cast glass sculptures and William on blown glass and enamel on glass. Their work is represented in public collections worldwide and featured in numerous books and periodicals.

Greg Fidler was awarded the glass

residency at the Penland School of Crafts from 2001-2004. In his Bakersville, NC, studio, he works in glass sculpture. Collaborating with glass artist Greg Cole, he recently established Ipso Facto Productions, a line of architectural blown glass in soaring shapes and vibrant colors.

Rob Levin is an internationally known glass artist who lives and works near Burnsville, NC. He was formerly the Resident Glass Artist at Penland School of Crafts, and has lectured, taught, and led workshops throughout the US and abroad. He has exhibited widely in the US, Europe, Japan, and the former Soviet Union, and his work is in numerous public and private collections, including the Corning Museum of Glass, the Museum of American Glass, the Museum of Arts and Design in New York and museums in Madrid, Denmark and Jerusalem. Each Levin piece is free-blown and hot-worked, then frosted by sand-blasting and acid-etching. Levin's mixed media pieces may incorporate a variety of techniques, including casting.

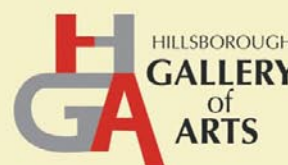
